Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

It is the season of new life! The coming of warm and sunny weather and fresh greenery is a welcome sight after the dark and cold and gray of winter and early spring.

As it happens, it's also the season for First Communions!!! Last weekend, 14 of St. John's little ones received Jesus for the very first time, and it was certainly a beautiful and moving occasion to behold. Next weekend, St. Bernard's children will do the same. I know they are very much looking forward to that as well!!!

Every time I witness the innocent joy and expectation with which these children approach the Most Blessed Sacrament for the first time, it is a moving experience. For me, I can also honestly say that it is also a bit of a convicting one. I've been a priest now for nearly 16 years, and like anything that we 'do' day in, day out for that long, it can become routine in our own minds and hearts.

There is NOTHING routine about receiving the Holy Eucharist. Even if it happens often, it should *never* be routine. One of the many things that I find moving about First Communion is perhaps the thing that is most apparent: the kids dress up! The boys are all decked out in their best finery, and the girls look almost like little brides. That by the way, is not an accident. Jesus is the Bridegroom of our souls. He wants to be united with us so dearly in the Eucharist, and each time we receive Him, it is meant to be a profound union of our soul to the Soul of Christ.

Do we treasure this gift? Do we think often enough that the Lord of the Universe, who made the stars and the planets, finds us infinitely more interesting than all of those things? Do we thank Him for making us and working to redeem and save us? Do we thank Him for all the people and abilities and time and profound experiences that we have received in our lives? Do we express our gratitude for all the struggles and difficulties and tragedies He has brought us through? These are all great things to ponder, both before and after we come to Communion.

My prayer is that as we witness these children coming before the Lord to receive Him, that we may regain that excitement, passion, and thankfulness that we once had. Jesus exhorts us to approach Him like little children, and in this case, the (First Communion) students can become our teachers.

Happenings at St. Bernard

There are two projects going on at St. Bernard currently.

1. A very generous donor (family member of a parishioner) gave money to be used toward a project at St. Bernard. The parish council decided to purchase a mosaic to be installed in the floor below the altar steps where people stand to receive communion. The mosaic is handcrafted with hand-cut marble and glass tesserae and will be a picture of a tabernacle and a chalice. This will be a beautiful reminder of this year of Eucharistic devotion. We hope to have it installed in the next



couple months. This project is completely funded by the donor so we are very thankful for their generosity!

2. The rectory renovation project has been approved by the parish council and the finance council which will begin the middle of May. The rectory is 50 years old and needs a little TLC to keep it looking nice for many years to come. We will be asking parishioners of the parish to help with moving furniture and wall hangings, removing the carpet, and help with painting a few doors or basement walls that need touched up. Starting the beginning of June, we have hired a couple businesses to paint the upstairs and replace the carpet with tile. The Altar Society will be paying for the painting while the general fund will cover the cost of the flooring.

We are blessed with wonderful facilities at St. Bernard and are so thankful for all those who generously give of your time, talent, and treasure to keep our parish looking beautiful! Please see any member of the parish council if you have any questions.
