

Dear Parishioners,

Last week a parishioner stopped and asked me a question about what we are supposed to do when we pray the Our Father at Mass. This parishioner attended a Mass where people were all holding hands. After the experience they were uncertain what it is that we are supposed to be doing.



The answer is that we are supposed to have our hands in the orans position, which is your hands extended and facing toward heaven. This is how the people prayed during the time of Christ. They would simply extend their hands as if they were lifting up their prayer toward heaven.

In the 1980s and 1990s it became popular, in different churches, that people held hands during the Our Father, however some people don't like to hold other people's hands. There are people who have different fears, phobias and social anxieties. In different parishes I have served, I have known people to go to the choir loft because they don't want to be around others, literally they would stand back against the wall in the choir loft. Holding hands with another would have made them feel very uncomfortable.

Liturgy, or more specifically the Mass, should bring the parish community together. That is why the Bishops in the United States around 2005 gave direction to all parishes, that we should use the orans position. Over time, people were doing all sorts of different things, and in Mass we should be in unison. If you break down the word communion, you have the word union.

That is also why we had the new translation of the Roman Missal for all English-speaking countries back in 2010. Holy Mother Church, from time to time, will need to reign us in when people begin to do things that steer away from the guidelines of the Church. "Catholic" means universal and we should be celebrating the Mass universally in a similar manner. The Document that often is referred to is the General Instruction of the Roman Missal or the GIRM. That is located in the first portion of the Roman Missal (the large red book the priest uses during Mass.) The GIRM gives clergy direction on how things are to be done in different liturgical situations and in public worship within in the Church. I hope this helps all of you understand that there are reasons why we do certain things, and that the "Church" must look at all Catholics and not just a few, so that we all can unite in our faith.
