

Some people have asked what a SCRIP is and what it looks like. SCRIPs are gift cards, or apps on smart phones that serve as a gift card, that businesses sell St. Joseph Catholic Parish at a discounted rate. The discount varies from 2% for Amazon to 20% for Dick Clark's and Lupe's.

Some of you might ask: What does this mean for St. Joseph? You might question if you should use SCRIPs. SCRIPs allow us to help our Parish financially as we purchase our day-to-day items and services. Both local and national stores and restaurants are available. They benefit and we benefit. They support the organizations, like our Parish, who support them.

School families are encouraged to use SCRIP to receive a discount on their tuition expense, yet there are still some who don't use the program. It is not only their loss, but also our school's and Parish's loss.

I use SCRIPS when going to the grocery store and often when I get gas. It is quick, easy, and it makes money go farther. I not only get the food I need at the rectory, but for the same price, I donate to St. Joseph, through the retailer. Maybe it is the German discipline in me, but I cannot understand why more people do not use this program. It has made a huge impact upon their Church and School through the years. We all have that opportunity to make a difference and we need more people to take advantage to make the most from their money.

Imagine what we could do in ministry to the students of our School and programs we could offer in our Church, if everyone bought their grocery, gas, and all their meals at restaurants through SCRIPs. When you don't know what style, gadget or color to get for a gift; buy a SCRIP gift card for your loved ones.

Thanks to volunteers who sell the SCRIPs. Their time and talent helps keep our overhead administration costs minimal, again making the most of this income. Occasionally, we have the parishioner who walks into the Parish Office who is a first-time buyer. The process is easy and simple. We will help you and answer questions you might have. You can buy SCRIPs in the Parish Office or on the weekend before or after Mass at the Stormont Street Entrance. Call the Parish Office at 812-385-2617 to place an order. I challenge each family to buy one SCRIP gift card this week, and see what a difference we can make!!!
