Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, Here we are once again at the precipice of Lent. With the coming of the Lenten season, we the People of God are once again invited into the desert with Moses and the Lord Jesus. As we know, the Bible is full of numbers of symbolic significance. 40 days of rain during the flood. 40 years wandering in the desert. 40 days being tempted by the devil. But what does this all mean? Forty is the number signifying purification. In the time of Noah, the world had become so corrupted by sin and strife that God had to cleanse the earth of that evil, save for the just man Noah and his kin. May we master our passions, embrace self-denial to intercede for others, and feed our minds with the Truth of God 5.38 by study and prayer.
