Greetings in Christ Jesus!

This past Thursday we celebrated the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, Apostle. Even though we celebrate this feast 'only' as a liturgical Feast, not as a Solemnity (the most important celebrations of the Church year), nevertheless this event is arguably one of the greatest single moments in the history of the Church besides the events of Christ's life itself.

How can I say this? It can be argued that Paul impacted more conversions and encounters with the Lord Jesus than the other 12 apostles did, perhaps even more than the great St. Peter himself. There is no question he was the most widely traveled, bouncing almost constantly back and forth through the entire Mediterranean realm, particularly in Greece and modern-day Turkey. He reached out to many, many peoples of gentile (that is, pagan) origin, while the 12 at least initially were more intent on the evangelization of their own Jewish people.

I believe it is safe to say that without Paul the great evangelizer, the True Faith would not have spread so rapidly, so far, and to so many peoples. However, the most remarkable and hopeful thing that we celebrate about Paul was the fact that he went in an instant from the most vitriolic hater of the Faith to the greatest and most courageous proponent of it! To credit God of course, His intervention in Paul's life by knocking him to the ground and blinding him for 3 days was quite a hard thing for anyone to ignore. To the credit of Paul, he was truly humble to the will of God, even though it cost him essentially everything in his life up to that point.

He was a young man that had everything going for him. He had the respect of the Pharisees, of which he was a prominent member. He was a proud son of the house of Benjamin. He was schooled in the law by the greatest of teachers, most notably the great Rabbi Gamaliel. Finally, he was so well respected by the chief priests and elders of the Jewish people that they gave him his every desire in going to round up and eliminate Christians. And when Jesus spoke to him on that rode to Damascus and asked him "Saul, why dost thou persecute me?" he gave it all up as "so much rubbish." Not only that, he went so far as to be flogged, shipwrecked, beaten, imprisoned, stoned, rejected, and finally beheaded all for the name of Christ Jesus. He was all too happy to do this, and often throughout his own letters to the Church, he *rejoiced* in the opportunity to suffer for that same Name.

May it so be for us as well? St. Paul of Tarsus, Apostle to the Gentiles, *Pray for us!*
