Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In keeping with my recent theme of writing about some of the great heroes of our Faith, I would like to share a few thoughts about St. Rita of Cascia, whose feast day we celebrate on Wednesday.

St. Rita may or may not be familiar to you. She is frequently called upon as a patroness of mothers of 'troublesome' children, as well as of difficult marriages. St. Rita was born in the late 1300s in central Italy, near the town of Roccaporena, the only child of her parents. She was raised practically next door to the church of St. Augustine, where a convent of Augustinian nuns resided. From an early age, she desired to enter the convent and commend her life to God in prayer. However, her parents had other designs. She was betrothed to a young man named Paulo, who was harsh, cruel, violent, and serially unfaithful to her. He was also essentially godless, and all of this was of course a great burden to her. Despite these heartaches, she bore him two sons.

However, she prayed constantly for his conversion, that he would leave his life of vice behind. Eventually, after nearly 18 years of marriage, her husband came around, and resolved to reform his life. Tragically, however, just when he was on the good path, he was killed by members of a rival family. While it was Divine Providence that he converted prior to his going to the judgement seat, the violence of his death was a shock to all. She worried constantly now not for her husband, but her sons, who now were hot-blooded youths bent on getting revenge on their father's murderers. She prayed fervently once again, this time that they would be prevented from carrying out these ill deeds. Again, providentially but tragically, before they could commit the sin of murder, both her sons took seriously ill and died.

Despite all her losses, she once again resolved to dedicate her life to God, now that her family had departed from her. There was an issue, however, with entering the convent she had always wanted to enter: there were family members of her husband's murderers there. The superior refused to allow her entry because of the turmoil it might cause. Determined, Rita went to both parties as a peacemaker, first to her husband's brothers, and then to the offending family, asking for peace between the families. Both agreed, and even had a formal reunion and signed a peace pact with one another and embraced.

All of this difficult work done, Rita finally was admitted at age 36 to the religious life, where she spent the next 40 years of her life in peace and mystical union with Christ. Such a painful, but inspiring life! I truly think it is not mystery why there are so many drawn to her as a patroness. Who doesn't understand what it's like to be wronged? Who doesn't find it such a challenge to forgive? Who doesn't know the pain of having loved ones taken from them suddenly or tragically? In all of these things, St. Rita, *Pray for us!!*

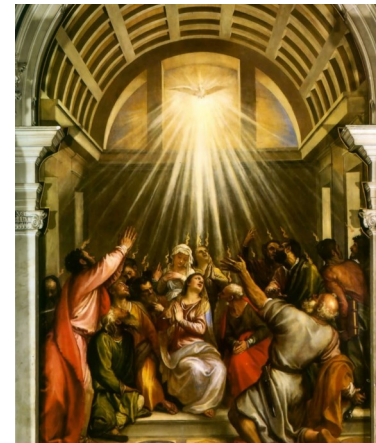
