

a letter from the pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This week I have been thinking about the Covid – 19 Pandemic. In mid – January of 2020, I first heard of this unknown Virus hitting a City of Wuhan in China. When a report came out, I noticed people wearing face masks and thought to myself; that will never happen here. Days that followed I heard the city went into Lockdown, again I thought that would never happen here. I humbly look back and recognize how wrong I was.

As I look back, I recall how difficult it truly was when Churches were closed. My heart ached. I was lonely, I missed the people, and I knew they missed going. I tried everything including outdoor confessions, Just before lockdown we had adoration with social distancing. I will never forget laughing out loud when two of my previous staff got into a discussion of the arrows directing traffic in Walmart and only two of us saw them.

My heart ached when we had funerals with only a hand full of people or when loved ones could not be with their family or friend who was dying. Not to mention using Facebook for livestreaming the Mass, videos of encouragement, even reading a book to the little ones in the school and in our Parish. The stress level was off the charts. However, I knew the sacrifice was worth it, for those whom I loved were scared, hurting and afraid. Moving to a new assignment was unique for both Fr. Brian and me.

Some got terminally sick, others were affected like a flu. Some have not gotten the virus while others I know have gotten it more than once, due to various strains of the virus. Some have gotten rather vocal and opinionated others just do what they can.

This past week the outbreak of cases across the State touched me deeply. I want you to know these things:

- ◇ Know of my prayers and support.
- ◇ I encourage you to help prevent the spread: be healthy and safe.
- ◇ I am grateful for the many sacrifices so many have made over the past two years.
- ◇ Even when we don't understand things, place your trust in God who can do all things.

As a priest I encourage you to continue to pray during these times and love as Christ taught us.
