ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

On July 14th, we celebrate the feast of the "Lily of the Mohawks." St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American woman to be canonized. Orphaned by a smallpox outbreak, Kateri survived with severe scarring and impaired eyesight. Despite

tragedy, she was a devout girl at a young age, often building crosses from sticks in the woods. When she was 18, she began secret instruction in the Catholic faith with French missionaries. Her commitment to Christianity and vow of virginity was misunderstood and ridiculed by her fellow villagers. She escaped to a nearby mission, where she attended daily Mass, taught the children, and cared for the sick and the elderly. Sometimes the greatest misunderstandings can come from those closest to us. Like St. Kateri, God invites us to be faithful to our commitments of faith and to always respond in love.

Dear Parishioners,

It is that time of year where we are spending time in the garden, or in the fields, tending to the plants/crops. We are benefiting from the produce from the market or the garden. This weekend Jesus uses a story or parable to teach us about the spiritual life. Using topics which we can relate to in our daily life, the Parable of the Sower reminds us that we must be careful of our spiritual life, being aware of it, tending it, and nurturing it.
