Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend the Gospel reading speaks of the man who sold everything for the treasure of a piece of land. The story is meant to remind believers that when you discover something that is valuable to you, your passion will lead you to go to extremes to hold onto that which you treasure.

This weekend I will be gone due to my nephew's wedding, and Baptizing my great niece. So, when I read this Gospel, I reflected on how spouses and parents often make sacrifices for the ones they love. One of my favorite Scripture passages is John 15:13 *No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.* At weddings I often quote this passage and remind the couple that spouses should have no greater friend than God and their spouse. When you love someone you will make great sacrifices for their well-being.

I recall the story of a man who came from a large family. He and his siblings often ate in shifts because the table was not large enough to fit their entire family. One day he walked in from the farm and caught his mom eating the leftovers from the family's meal. It was then he realized she would prepare their meal, and what was left over is what she would be able to eat. I recall this grown man crying as he told the story of the great love his mother had for him and his siblings. All these stories and examples that Jesus provided, and I shared, should remind us of the great love that God has for us.

When we discover our faith and develop it, we understand God's great love and compassion for us. There is no greater love than that which God has for us. He gave us life, sacrificed His only Son, and continues to reach out to us in times of need and times of celebration. Too often people forget this and feel the sacrifice of an hour of their week is too much, after God has given us so much. In our faith, we must develop our relationship with God. That includes making sacrifices, like our time at weekly or daily Mass, daily prayers, and time spent learning of Christ, his disciples, His mother Mary, and the Saints throughout history. It is not that you have to sell things, but make choices to spend your time and energy on and with the ones you cherish and love. While I am away with my family this weekend, know you will be in my prayers. Please thank Fr. Ray who will join you, he made the sacrifice of his time so I could attend these family events, for that I am grateful. Blessings to you all.
