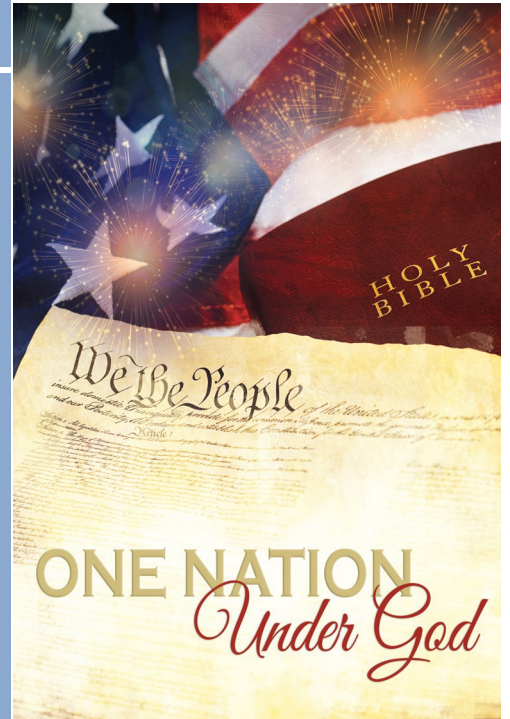

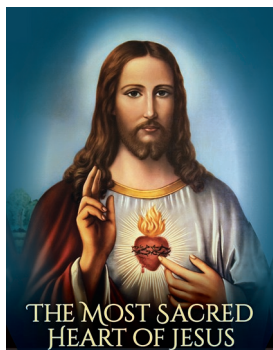

From the  
Pastor's Desk

Dear Family,

For both St. Joseph and St. Bernard Parishes the cemetery is a sacred space. In this place rests the members of our families who we care for deeply. Both parishes can take pride in how well the cemeteries are maintained and cared for.

For St. Joseph the time has arrived to expand the cemetery. Last December I talked about how there is need for more lots for burials. The time has arrived to finish the last section of the cemetery. As you know, we have three "squares" that are used for burials. Each square is outlined by the roads of the cemetery. One square on the southwest corner of the cemetery has been used for farmland. This "square" will become the new section of the cemetery.

Once this project is completed the cemetery will have enough lots available for all of our lifetimes. The project requires more exact engineering than one would initially expect. The work will include the creation of new roads, construction of drainage, preparing the ground so that it can be used for burials, and seeding the ground. It is also true that in this age, nothing is cheap. The estimate for the project is \$64,000. The plan is to finish this project by the end of the fall.

I will be sending a letter to all St. Joseph families asking to join in support for this project. There is no perfect time to do a project like this, but now is the time we need to do it. I am also aware that we have many demands for giving throughout the year. Once you receive the letter, I only ask that you pray about what you can give, and make that donation. The cemetery is a very special place to make a donation. I can't think of any place more personal, and connected to the people we love, and also, those in the future that will be buried there.

Following the close of the first academic year program, the House hosted a Mass and cookout for the residents and their families, as well as for friends of the House. More than 225 people attended.

This fall, one House resident will enter seminary for our diocese. Another young man has been attending the House's weekly Monday night Holy Hour & Mass for Vocations since the fall. Having spent time with the House Director and residents each week for formation conferences, Mass and prayer, he has decided to enter the seminary with a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right this fall. In addition to these two celibate vocations, more than 60 teenage boys attended Savio Night monthly gatherings of faith formation at the House. Savio Night will begin again this fall with the arrival of new House residents.
