My class at the Pontifical North American College was privileged to meet Pope Francis in the late summer of 2020. After going through security, we were escorted to the back of St. Peter's Basilica where we then ascended the stairs to the Clementine Hall where the Pope receives visitors. We waited for him, sweltering in our cassocks on that hot Italian day. Eventually His Holiness arrived, with a severe limp no doubt due to his sciatica. He shook our hands and prayed with us, asking us to pray for him as well, doing the best he could with his weak English, but strong Italian. Thankfully there was a translator.

Meeting the Pope is like meeting a fictional character from a novel turned into flesh and bone, or like meeting a great historical figure who died centuries ago. He is a man; broken, limping, and, like all of us, I am sure he has his own sins and crosses on his back, some for public viewing and others that only God can see. The Vicar of Christ. The Bishop of Rome. Pope. Servant of the Servants of God. Heir of men who forged pacts of peace, repelled barbarians, declared war, died horrible (but glorious) martyrdoms for love of Christ, sinned horribly, lavishly, but always preserved the Church from error, safeguarding orthodoxy and the faith given to us by Jesus Christ. The pope. A man who may inspire us, or frustrate us, but always there to remind us; the Church is not ours. She belongs to Christ, and He will guide her.

Another time at this great basilica, I had the opportunity to tour the tombs beneath the foundations of the great church, and venerate the jaw bone of St. Peter. The first pope. The man who said, "You are the Christ, the son of the living God," and who also denied Jesus three times, but ultimately reconciled with Him. Another time I was at the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls (built outside the original walls of Rome) where St. Paul's remains are. There I venerated this man who frustrates, challenges, bores, and inspires us. A man who told us that he had a thorn in his side, but did not disclose what that thorn was. A little cross, that only Christ could see. A man who reminds us to never boast, except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We, like the popes and bishops that Christ has set over His Church, are flawed persons. But we have been baptized into Christ's Church, along with Pope Francis, in the Faith first entrusted to St. Peter and preached by St. Paul. And that should give us immeasurable hope. After all, listen to the words of Christ in today's gospel for those who welcome His messengers. "The kingdom of God is at hand for you."
