

VARDSHIP OF TREASURE

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Peace to you,

Since I last wrote on the Imitation of Christ, I move on to the so -called "Third Book" which concerns the subject of internal consolation in the soul. All of us seek to be at peace, not only with ourselves, but also with others and especially with God. This last is the highest priority! If we possess God and the peace that only He can give, then we already possess far more than anything or anyone in the world can give to us, for they are finite creatures, and He is infinite. The reflections in this section and remaining throughout the rest of the book are written in a kind of dialogue between we the disciple and the Lord (the Voice of Christ). These are in a sense kind of sample conversations that can be had with the Lord as examples. Many of them are quotations from Scripture as well as good theological insights. What is important to know is that when we show up in prayer we should not expect a booming voice from heaven, nor should we be disappointed when this does not happen. The voice of Christ is His Word in the Holy Scriptures and in the Magisterial teachings of His Church. The more we understand these, the more we know the mind, the words, and the will of Christ Jesus. He also speaks to us without words in the instincts and movements of our heart and conscience. When we are faced with temptation, we most often know what is right and what is wrong. The confusion we often feel is actually not lacking the knowledge of the will of God, but rather lacking the strength, conviction, or devotion to do the difficult right thing. Rather it is much easier to do the wrong thing in our weakness and fallenness. This is what we seek when we come to prayer: clarity, strength, conviction, and consolation. When we bring our struggles and uncertainties before the Lord, he clarifies the Divine Truth in our hearts and souls and minds. He strengthens us to be steadfast and gives us conviction to follow Him in the decisions and situations of our lives. Finally, he consoles us in our sorrows and gives us His peace. In addition, He most often does this in silence. It is true that good, holy, and truthful thoughts will occur to us more readily in prayer, and we should listen to that, because He can often speak this way to us. No matter what may come to us in prayer even if the insights are daunting or difficult, they are usually accompanied with a subtle sense of peace. This is our hint that this is probably the right thing. Thomas a Kempis gives a great little prayer to plead for the Lord to speak to us when we present ourselves in prayer: "Speak, therefore, Lord, for Your servant listens. 'Thou hast the words of eternal life.' Speak to me for the comfort of my soul and for the amendment of my life, for Your praise, Your glory, and Your everlasting honor."
