Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's day and age, we tend to think of the human person as being a 'free agent' who can determine their own course and even define ourselves. We make our opinions and ourselves the measure of all things. This is a false Enlightenment idea. It is false because we have inherent dignity not because we are so great, but because we are created in the Image and Likeness of God who really is great. If we always remember this fact, that we are nothing without Him Who made us, then we are truly humble. We should hang on every word of God and strive to do what He asks of us. For the earthly person, this is a bitter pill to swallow, but for the humble person, it is delight to lean completely on the will and strength and grace of God. Many of us were told as small children, "believe in yourself'. The humble attitude is to be wary of myself, but believe in the goodness and grace of Jesus.

Thomas a Kempis encourages us to walk before God in humility and truth. Humility is acknowledging the truth that we are nothing without God. Therefore, we know that everything good comes from Him and is made possible by Him. Christ assures us:

"Consider your sins with great displeasure and sorrow, and never think yourself to be someone because of your good works. You are truly a sinner. You are subject to many passions and entangled in them. Of yourself, you always tend to nothing. You fall quickly, are quickly overcome, quickly troubled, and quickly undone. You have nothing in which you can glory, but you have many things for which you should think yourself vile, for you are much weaker than you can comprehend. Hence, let none of the things you do seem great to you. Let nothing seem important or precious or desirable except that which is everlasting. Let the eternal truth please you above all things, and let your extreme unworthiness always displease you. Fear nothing, abhor nothing, and [run from] nothing as you do your own vices and sins; these should be more unpleasant for you than any material losses.

My child, walk before Me in truth, and seek Me always in the simplicity of your heart. He who walks before Me in truth shall be defended from the attacks of evil, and the truth shall free him from seducers and from the slanders of wicked men. For if the truth has made you free, then you shall be free indeed, and you shall not care for the vain words of men."

I realize that these words can be rather harsh to our modern sensibilities, but the Lord does not want just our mere material good here in this short life. He wants our ultimate good for eternity. Therefore, knowing our weakness we should be more terrified and disgusted with our sin and seek the things of God and goodness with more passion. This is a gift and grace that we should always beg the Lord for in prayer: to have a more fervent desire for holiness and a greater sorrow for our sins. In this way, we can be sure that our compass will always be set aright.
