Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

As part of the ongoing celebration of the Christmas Octave, we commemorate two great realities tied with the coming of the Lord. The Sunday after Christmas is always the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, and the conclusion of the octave comes on Jan 1st, the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God (a holy day of obligation). Both of these are directly tied to the mystery of Christmas in a profound way. This is because God not only chose to come to us as a human being, but also as a part of a human family.

This is one of many reasons why the Church has always upheld the dignity and necessity of a healthy and holy family for the health of the Church and of the world. Without the family living, working, and loving as it should, things fall apart.

These mysteries also show the great humility of God and at the same time the great exaltedness of our human nature because of the Incarnation. Obedience is the key to healing everything in fallen creation. Mary was exalted and received the singular honor of being the Mother of God simply because of her obedience. Jesus was obedient to the will of the Father, which was that he would remain hidden, humble, and unknown for the vast majority of his life. Consider that Jesus submitted himself to two of his creatures (Mary and Joseph) for 30 years. He did not just do what they asked. He did nothing but this for three decades. When Joseph died, Jesus continued His guiet life of service by simply working as a craftsman as Joseph had. He did this not because it was the only thing He could do, but because he took his responsibility to support his widowed mother with the utmost seriousness. He also desired to show us through his own work and humble labor that we are dignified and sanctified through our own labors!

Also consider God's choice of family for Jesus, and consider what God finds most important and of the highest priority. It is very telling that God did not pick a family that was wealthy, or powerful, or well placed, or highly educated. He picked a family that was above all pious. They observed God's law. Mary was deferent to Joseph. Joseph was concerned about the protection of Mary and Jesus as well as working hard to provide for them. All were observant and practicing Jews. Everything was properly ordered within the family, and the whole family was ordered to God the Father above all.

These celebrations remind us that God wishes that we be not necessarily successful by any worldly measure, but faithful to God and His will for us above all things. The Holy Family provides for us the perfect model for life and true success.

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, pray for us!

St. Bernard Relic

You may have noticed the monstrance reliquary on the altar which contains a relic of St. Bernard of Clairvaux, our patron. One of our high school students noticed it was in the sacristy closet. A first-class relic are the physical remains of a saint and can include pieces of bone or hair.

*Saint Bernard of Clairvaux, born in 1090, was a renowned French monk and theologian. He entered the Abbey of Cîteaux and quickly became one of its most influential members. His piety and his eloquence earned him to attract many disciples and to found several monasteries, including that of Clairvaux. He participated actively in the reform of the Church and was a fervent defender of the crusades. His theological and spiritual writings, such as "On

Grace and Free Will", are still authoritative today. He died in 1153 and was canonized shortly thereafter.
