Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In just over a week, Holy Mother Church will invite us into the Lenten journey once again. As we know, the Bible is full of numbers of symbolic significance. 40 days of rain during the flood. 40 years wandering in the desert. 40 days being tempted by the devil. But what does this all mean? Forty is the number signifying purification.

The question is always of course, from what do we need to be purified? The People of God were made to wander in the deserts of Sinai for 40 years before being allowed to enter the Promised Land. This was to purify them of their idolatry and distrust of the power and love of God to protect and provide for them. Many were not confident that God could allow them to conquer the mighty nations that occupied what would eventually become Israel. Because of their lack of faith, he allowed them to have to depend totally on Him and the manna and springs that He would provide for them. Thus a new generation of people would learn to trust the Lord in all things and love Him above all else.

As we go through this next week before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent, let us really ponder what idols or ways of seeking comfort we tend to run to rather than to God. Idolatry is so much more than carving and worshiping literal idols. Idols are sneaky. They are the lesser things that we make our god when we often do not even realize we are doing so. Our idols can be nearly anything. Maybe they are relationships. Maybe they are the schedule by which we have tended to live our lives. Perhaps they are our material possessions or even homes. Perhaps they are the work that we do, recreation, booze, sex, or any of those things. Perhaps it is our phone, computer, or social media. Essentially anything can be an idol.

So how can I tell if I am idolizing something? One sure sign is if we tend to run to some thing or behavior for soothing or relief instead of turning first to God in our hearts in prayer. Of all the things God was angriest about in the Old Testament, idolatry was at the top of the list. God wants to be our all-in-all, because He knows that only He can be our all-in-all. Everything else in our lives is only meant to point us to Him.

I distinctly remember John Muir, a seminarian (now a priest) for the Diocese of Phoenix who was a couple years ahead of me once wrote a humorous song titled Shoot Your Cows. The point of it is that once we figure out that we have a kind of 'golden calf' in our lives that ends up not bringing us closer to God, but keeping us from Him, we have to discard it. We at least need to hand that thing, person, or behavior over to God in prayer and perhaps the confessional and ask Him to make it less in our hearts. Often the only real option is to root it out of our lives entirely. We should always be willing to put God first, and if we are too weak to do so, give Him the permission to take from us what we cannot give up on our own. Let us do this last preparation for Lent with intention and fervor!
