Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope that all are off to a good start in this new year of 2024! As your pastor, I once again wish to profoundly thank all those who extended to me their wonderful Christmas wishes, cards, and generosity. I truly feel loved and I love you. Thank you for another great year!

As this Sunday is the feast of Epiphany, I thought I would once again give people the ability to bless their homes with the traditional Epiphany blessing with blessed chalk. The chalk and prayer of blessing left for you all is a wonderful way to ask the Lord's blessing upon you and your family this year. Some, however, might want a little explanation of what this is and what it entails.

It's often a topic of conversation when people see the strange chalked inscription above the doors of a home. "What is that?" Well, for this year, the inscription will be as follows:

20 + C + M + B + 24

This has two primary meanings. The beginning and ending numbers are of course the numbers of the year of the blessing. The crosses represent the saving Cross of Christ, and the letters CMB has a dual meaning. One is that it stands for the initials of the traditional names of the three wise men, Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar. The other meaning is a Latin inscription: Christus Mansionem Benedicat, or may Christ bless this home. Traditionally the prayer can be done either by a priest or usually by the father of the family or other head of the home.

I think the benefit of this practice is obvious. First, any blessing helps to ward off the spiritual attacks and annoyances of the Evil One. Second, this can be a constant and visible reminder anytime one is entering and leaving the home that Christ is to be the focus and the foundation for the family and those living there. I pray that you all will do this blessing and will invite Christ more deeply into your daily life and family this year. May we always honor and adore Christ as did the three great Magi of the east!


