Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Thomas of Kempen in his 3rd chapter of the Imitation of Christ next exhorts us to seek the Truth. This is of course Jesus Christ, the divine Logos, the one who is in the beginning with God and is God. He once again encourages us not to seek knowledge in vain. That is, while knowledge is a good thing and God desires us to have it, it is to be given to us for a purpose. It must change our lives for the better!

"Every perfection in this life has some imperfection mixed with it and no learning of ours is without some darkness. Humble knowledge of self is a surer path to God than the ardent pursuit of learning. Not that learning is to be considered evil, or knowledge, which is good in itself and so ordained by God; but a clean conscience and virtuous life ought always to be preferred. Many often err and accomplish little or nothing because they try to become learned rather than to live well.

If men used as much care in uprooting vices and implanting virtues as they do in discussing problems, there would not be so much evil and scandal in the world, or such laxity in religious organizations. On the day of judgment, surely, we shall not be asked what we have read but what we have done; not how well we have spoken but how well we have lived."

Powerful and simple words! Knowledge is for helping us to know how to live! As the Scriptures tell us, we should not be hearers of the word only, but doers of the word. Anything else is simply our desire to glorify ourselves with how much we know. This glory is fleeting, because one day we will pass from this world and our knowledge will pass with us, and the world will remember us no more for what we said or learned, but for what we did. Moreover, if we did little or nothing, we will be remembered little or not at all. Therefore, what did just knowing things profit us?

St. Thomas Aquinas tells us that curiosity is not a virtue, but rather a vice. However, desire to know something because it teaches us about God and how we are to live in this life can be a very good thing. Therefore, what Thomas à Kempis asks us to keep in mind with our pursuits is "how will this profit me for eternal life and glorifying God?" This will greatly help us to set our priorities and use our time very wisely indeed, and certainly help to transform and redeem our world. Peace to you,
