THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Curiosity killed the cat," they say. Most of us are curious creatures, and this of course is bourn out of our desire to discover and to know. The seeking of knowledge is not necessarily a bad thing of course. After all, it is a gift of the Holy Spirit with regards to religious truths! However, there is the seeking of legitimate knowledge and learning, and there is curiosity. In fact, excess curiosity according to St. Thomas Aquinas can actually be a vice!

In his Summa Theologiae, St. Thomas points out several ways in which our curiosity can get us into trouble. Firstly, he says that we indulge the vice of curiosity when we put off the study and acquiring the knowledge of things, we are obliged to know. Second, we fall into vice when we seek knowledge from "unlawful teachers". This would include such 'teachers' as horoscopes, occult knowledge, divination, or even seeking knowledge from those who are Catholic, but who tear down faith in God and His Church. Next, we violate true study when we fail to refer back to the ultimate goal, which is God. Fourth, he points out that studying something that is actually beyond our natural ability to grasp can be a prideful pursuit. As my grandpa used to say, we shouldn't "get too big for our britches."

Finally, Thomas a Kempis shares with us that we should also avoid curiosity about others, which of course leads to envy and gossip and other things destructive to the social order. In his reflection, he has Christ convey:

"My child, do not be curious. Do not trouble yourself with idle cares. What matters this or that to you? Follow Me. What is it to you if a man is such and such, if another does or says this or that? You will not have to answer for others, but you will have to give an account of yourself. Why, then, do you meddle in their affairs?

Behold, I know all men, I see everything that is done under the sun, and I know how matters stand with each – what is in his mind and what in his heart and the end to which his intention is directed. Commit all things to Me, therefore, and keep yourself in good peace, Let him who is disturbed be as restless as he will. Whatever he has said or done will fall upon himself, for he cannot deceive Me.

Do not be anxious for the shadow of a great name, for the close friendship of many, or for the particular affection of men. These things cause distraction and cast great darkness about the heart. I would willingly speak My word and reveal My secrets to you, if you would watch diligently for My coming and open you heart to Me. Be prudent, then. Watch in prayer, and in all things humble yourself.
