Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The month of November is traditionally observed within the Church as a special time to remember the lives of those who have passed beyond the veil of death and out of the sight of our earthly lives. This is beautiful because of two great truths: we believe as Christians that we are all a connected family, and that our human life does not end with physical death. We give testimony to this with two great celebrations at the beginning of the month next week: The Solemnity of All Saints (Nov. 1st), and the feast of All Souls (Nov. 2nd).

All Saints Day is exceptionally important to us Catholics. It is, after all, a holy day of obligation. But why? The saints are every bit as much a part of the Body of Christ as we are, but in their perfected state, they are even closer to the heart of God and in perfect unity with Him and with one another, though they are invisible to our eyes. We celebrate the memorials and feasts of individual saints throughout the Church year, but on this day, we honor them as the heavenly host, the great cloud of witnesses that spurs us on to the life of blessedness. They are the great heroes we look to as models and guides on how to walk this journey through earthly life. And what a diverse and fascinating group they are! They were from every state and walk of life, in practically every time and place. As I like to say, while the Gospels give our minds and hearts the bones of Christ Jesus in his teachings and major life events, it is the saints that help us to flesh out those bones. In their way of life, their heroic struggle against sin, and yes, even in their sufferings and triumphs each of them shows us in the flesh yet another illustration of what Christ is like.

The next day, on All Souls day, we remember and pray for our loved ones who have died, particularly those who have died in the past year. We pray for their purification and their triumphal entry into heaven with the very saints we have celebrated the day before. In a sense, the Mass for all souls is a common funeral for all our parishioners, family, and friends who have died. It also stresses for us the importance of prayer on behalf of the dead in general. We remain connected in love to them, even though they have passed beyond our sight.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints this coming Wednesday, let us keep all this in mind and heart. St. John's will celebrate the Holy Day at 7am and 5:30pm Wednesday, and St. Bernard will have a 7pm Mass Wednesday. All Souls prayer services will be held at St. John's cemetery at 4:30pm Thursday the 2nd. St. Bernard will have a candlelight procession to the cemetery to honor our deceased loved ones following the 6pm All Souls Mass that same evening. Let us give thanks to Almighty God for the gift that they have been for us, and express our yearning to be with Him and with our brothers and sisters again.
