Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This month is of course another Marian month of the year (in addition to May). October is also known as the month of the Rosary, especially due to the celebration of the victory of Catholic Europe over the Turkish navy at the battle of Lepanto in 1571. The victory was attributed to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, as the Pope had asked all Catholics to pray the rosary for victory before the battle.

In addition to this, on the first of October is the feast day of St. Therese of Lisieux, one of my favorite saints, and one of the most popular in the world today in terms of personal devotion.

There are many reasons for this. First of all, she was a young, vibrant French woman whose spiritual journals and autobiography has been published for all the world since her death. But it is the treasure to be found there that is most compelling. Even though Therese was only 24 when she died in 1897, and was almost unknown to the world outside of the tiny Carmelite monastery where she lived, in a few short years her diary would take the world by storm and quickly lead to her canonization.

The central thrust of her life was to embody love to those around her. This was frequently done in the most simple and unremarkable things of daily life. However, it was the fervor and intention with which she did things that was truly remarkable. Even though there were people and things that caused her great annoyance, she would always offer them acts of love and kindness. She saw this as a great sacrifice and gift to God Whom she loved, and Whom she knew loved her as a little child. In fact, she realized seeing ourselves as children before God as essential to 'getting' the Christian life. In acknowledging our littleness and helplessness before God, we ironically gain all things, by trusting in Him in all things.

Her simple but profound teachings are mainstays for anyone in ANY walk of life, and no matter our age. In fact, Saint John Paul found her teachings so important that less than 20 years ago he declared her a doctor (that is teacher) of the Church alongside such spiritual and intellectual giants as St. Augustine and St. Thomas Aquinas.

I encourage everyone to look more into what she teaches for living a life of everyday holiness. Her autobiography, Story of a Soul, is a short and informative read, and contains many pearls of wisdom. Also, there are several books written by Fr. Jacques Philippe, who does an excellent job of unpacking and explaining how her ideas can find a place in your home and in your heart. I can especially recommend The Way of Trust and Love.


