Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In keeping with the liturgical feasts we have had of late, I wanted to take an opportunity to speak about the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows (September 15th). This feast is intimately linked with the celebration of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, which I wrote about last week (September 14th).

The celebration, Our Lady of Sorrows, has been a universal celebration for the past 500 years. The Servites of Mary are responsible for spreading the Seven Sorrows rosary, or the Seven Sorrows Chaplet (a rosary-like chaplet that consists of 7 sets of 7 Hail Mary beads, with Our Father beads in between). This feast recalls the great sufferings that Our Lady endured in raising her beloved Son and seeing Him die such an ignoble and brutal death. The Seven Sorrows are based on various accounts from the Gospels, and are as follows: The Prophecy of Simeon ("and your own heart a sword shall pierce.") (Luke 2:34-35) The Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13) The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:43-45) Mary meets Jesus as He carries His cross The Crucifixion of Jesus (John 19:25) Loww² side is pierced with a lange and Uia bedwis taken down from the

Jesus' side is pierced with a lance and His body is taken down from the cross (Matthew 27:57-59)

Jesus' burial (John 19:40-42)

This devotion is a powerful spiritual weapon against the powers of evil and the devil. Exorcists frequently speak of the effectiveness of Marian devotion in delivering people from attacks of the Evil One. They hate her! This is especially true of the devotion to her under the title of Our Lady of Sorrows and the praying of the 7 Sorrows chaplet or 7 Sorrows Rosary (or Servite Rosary). Mary's willingness to suffer innocently and humbly the pains of these mysteries is very repugnant to the prideful demons. In drawing close to her and uniting our own sufferings in life to hers (and those of her Son of course), we also bring the redemptive power of those offerings to bear against evil. Our world today knows no shortage of evil, or suffering. However, we can offer those sufferings in a very powerful way through this devotion for the salvation of the world and the undoing of the kingdom of evil.

We as Catholics always hold these sorrowful events in our salvation in dear memory. First, it is the sacrifice of Jesus and the fervent prayers of His mother that offer us salvation and that maintain us in our pilgrimage here on Earth. In addition, by pondering the sufferings that Jesus went through for our good, it should make us love Him all the more and be willing to suffer in turn for His honor and glory and for the salvation of souls.
