**Peter Hommes**

Peter Hommes was born on August 18, 1855, in Ernst, near Cochem, in the Diocese of Trier, Rheinland, Germany. Peter's primary education was begun at Cochem in 1868 until 1871. Then he went to Trier from 1871 until 1876. Two years were spent in Trond, Belgium studying philosophy, 1877 - 1878.


In August of 1878, Peter left home and country to sail from Havre, France to New York. St. Meinrad College in Indiana was his objective. His aim was to take a course in theology in preparation for the priesthood.

Peter was ordained on June 11, 1881, by Bishop Chatard. Peter celebrated his first Mass on June 19 in Napoleon where his friend from seminary, Fr. Adam Fergen was the pastor.

Fr. Hommes' first assignment was in Vincennes where he assisted Fr. Peythieu from July 4 until November 1, 1881. That parish with its many missions was a laborious time for him.

On July 9, 1885, Peter took charge of St. Joseph in Princeton for a short time. Then he went to reside at St. Bernard's Church at Snake Run. At St. Bernard's he built a frame rectory (\$1200) in 1888 and a frame church (\$3,000) measuring 86x40 feet with a 100 foot tower. Fr. Hommes took care of 30 families in Princeton as a mission and 40 families at St. Bernard.

Fr. Hommes was a scholarly gentleman, a critic on the leading topics of the day and contributed to various journals and papers of Catholic renown. He was well regarded among the priesthood and respected by protestants wherever he went.
